2.1 PRIMARY QUALIFYING PROCEDURES

- Primary Race Order Qualifying

- Open entries
- Each rider gets a practice session
- 1-22 Riders
 - One heat race (22 riders) all riders transfer to main, qualifying for gate selection only.
- 23-42 Riders
 - Two heat races per class (21 riders ea.) Top 10 qualify to Main Event, 11-21 transfer to last chance qualifier
 - One last chance qualifier top 2 qualifies to Main Event
- 43-62 Riders
 - Three heat races per class (2x21 riders ea., 1x20 riders) Top 6 qualify to Main Event
 - Two last chance qualifiers, top 2 from each qualifies to Main Event
- 63-82 Riders
 - Four heat races per class (2x21 riders ea., 2x20 riders ea.) Top 4 qualify to Main Event
 - Three last chance qualifiers, top 2 from each qualifies to Main Event
- 83-88 Riders
 - Four heat races per class (4x22 riders ea.) Top 3 qualify to Main Event
 - Five last chance qualifiers, top 2 from each qualifies to Main Event
- 89-110 Riders
 - Five heat races per class (5x22 riders ea.) Top 2 qualify to Main Event
 - Six last chance qualifiers, top 2 from each qualifies to Main Event

- **Primary > Premier Qualifying Procedure**
 - Top 22 from each Primary qualify for Premier
 - Alternates taken in finishing order from Last Chance Qualifier(s) with fastest overall LCQ being first seed, second fastest will be second seed, etc.

- **Premier Alternate Procedure**
 - Once all primary events are completed if there are not 22 riders entered at all Premier events additional alternates will be chosen.
 - Additional alternates will be chosen based on the highest average finishing position and the most events attended.
 - Example: If a rider attends five events and has an average finishing position of 3rd that said rider would be first alternate ahead of a rider that only attends 4 events and also has an average finishing position of 3rd and so on.
 - If there is a tie in average finishing position within the same amount of events then the qualified rider would be the rider with the highest finishing position at an event.
 - If there is still a tie in average finishing within the same amount of events attended then the qualified rider would be the rider that attended the event with the highest entry count.
 - If the highest entry count is the same in more than one event the preferred event would be the first event held with the highest total entry count.
 - When all primary events are completed a list of those riders will be made and the first rider on that list will have choice of one Premier event they would like to enter down to the final rider on the list.
 - Once that list has been exhausted it will be ran through again as many times as needed until 22 riders have been entered at all of the Premier events.
 - * A DNS (Did Not Start) for the entire event will not be eligible for an alternate position.

3.1 CLASS SPECIFICS

Rules:

- In addition to these Supercross Futures supplemental rules all racing is governed by the 2021 AMA Racing Rulebook.

Eligibility:

- To be eligible to race in the Supercross Futures class, riders must be age and skill appropriate to the class they will be competing in and must hold a current AMA membership.

Road to Supercross through the 250 Futures Class:

Qualifying through the 250 Futures class

- 4 points required to earn license
- Riders must qualify and race at least one (1) Premier Qualifier in order to earn points
- Points will be earned at Premier Qualifiers and the National Championship
- Points will be earned based on the scale below:

- 250 Futures points will be earned in a continuous 24 month period

Transponders:

- Transponders may be required- refer to local Primary Qualifier track information. If you own a MyLaps compatible transponder, you may run your own, however you must bring it to registration to verify it works properly. If you do not own one, a transponder may be rented on-site.

Frame Number:

- The last 4 digits of the frame number on the motorcycle you will be competing on are required to register for any Supercross Futures Primary Qualifier.
